Trumer Pilsener, Berkeley ... \$ 4.00 (330 ml)
 Brewed locally by the Austrian brewery, this Pilsener has won the Gold medal at the 2010 Great American Beer Festival for its distinct hops flavor of a German style Pilsener.

Widmer Hefeweizen, Portland ... \$ 4.00 (330 ml)
 Light in sweetness and great in taste.
 Brewed since 1979 when home brewing was legalized in Oregon.

Pilsener and Helles

Jever Pilsener 4,9%, Jever, Schleswig-Holstein, North Germany ... \$ 5.00 (330 ml)
 A real Pilsener with a strong hops character.
 "Wie das Land so das Jever."

Königs Pilsener 4,9%, Duisburg, North Rhine-Westphalia, West Germany ... \$ 5.00 (330 ml)
 The first German premium Pilsener.

Gaffel Kölsch 4,8%, Cologne, North Rhine-Westphalia, West Germany ... \$ 6.00 (330 ml)
 A Kölsch may only be brewed in the city of Cologne, and Gaffel Kölsch has an excellent reputation throughout Germany for its distinctive lively and smooth hops taste.

Augustinerbräu Edelstoff 5,7%, Munich, Bavaria, South Germany ... \$ 6.50 (330 ml)
 The oldest brewery in Munich (since 1328) brews this fine and fresh tasting bottom fermented beer with its light hops aroma.

Schönramer Gold 5,7%, Petting, Bavaria, South Germany ... \$ 8.00 (500 ml)
 With the aroma of chestnut honey and a perfect balance between malt and hops you will have a refreshing adventure.
 It has won the World Cup Beer Award in 2010.

Dunkel and Bock

Einbecker Mai Urbock 6,5%, Einbeck, Lower Saxony, North Germany ... \$ 7.00 (330 ml)
 The Mai Urbock is being brewed only between March and Mai; a true original by one of the oldest breweries in Germany which is more than 600 years old.

Einbecker Urbock Dunkel 6,5%, Einbeck ... \$ 7.00 (330 ml)
 A strong and robust taste that comes from the dark malt it is brewed with.

Köstritzer Schwarzbier 4,8%, Bad Köstritz, Thuringia, East Germany ... \$ 6.00 (330 ml)
 Brewed by one of the oldest German breweries (1495) and enjoyed by Goethe this is a dark dry beer yet full in body.

Augustinerbräu Maximator 7,5%, Munich, Bavaria, South Germany ... \$ 6.50 (330 ml)
 An ale like beer with a deep rich malt flavor.

Reutberger Klosterbier Export Dunkel 5.2%, Reutberg, Bavaria, South Germany ... \$ 8.50 (500 ml)
 Heavenly brewed for more than 300 years in a cloister located South of Munich. Dark malt gives this beer its distinctive flavor.

Schönramer Saphir Bock Starkbier 8%, Petting, Bavaria, South Germany ... \$ 8.50 (330 ml)
 Fresh, strong, and zesty, this beer is one of its kind.

Hefe Weißbier

Franziskaner Hefe-Weißbier Naturtrüb (unfiltered) 4,9%,
Munich, Bavaria, South Germany ... \$ 8.50 (500 ml)

This Hefeweizen is refreshing and lightly zesty in flavor, and it will dance on the tongue.

Franziskaner Hefe-Weißbier Dunkel (unfiltered) 4,9%, Munich ... \$ 8.50 (500 ml)

The amber colored beer will carry a full malt aroma with a smooth taste and a hint of caramel.

Erdinger Weißbier 5,3%, Erding, Bavaria, South Germany ... \$ 7.50 (500 ml)

Bottle fermented for 3-4 weeks and with a full wheat aroma this beer taste lightly fruity yet very refreshing.

Brewed by the world's largest wheat brewery since 1886.

Erdinger Dunkel 5,3%, Erding ... \$ 8.50 (500 ml)

Amber colored and with a full bodied taste of malt and hops this Dunkel is brewed according to an old recipe and matured in the bottle you have in front of you.

Hopf Helle Weiße (unfiltered) 5,3%, Miesbach, Bavaria, South Germany ... \$ 7.00 (330 ml)

The distinctive fruity and refreshing taste credits the special mixture of 1/3 barley malt and 2/3 wheat malt.

Matches very nicely vegetarian dishes as well as poultry and fish.

Hopf Dunkle Weiße 5,0%, Miesbach ... \$ 8.00 (500 ml)

The fresh and fruity taste has been developed by highly fermented dark barley malt and wheat malt.

Very nice with pan fried fish, beef and pork, strong cheese, and sweet desserts.

Hopf Weisser Bock (unfiltered) 7,0%, Miesbach ... \$ 9.00 (500 ml)

The fullest body of a wheat you can get. Carries a light hint of smoke. Goes well with lamb and our Pretzel dishes.

Schönramer Festweisse Naturtrüb (unfiltered) 5,6%,
Petting, Bavaria, South Germany ... \$ 8.00 (500 ml)

Amber colored, a harmony of yeasty and citrusy taste, and refreshingly delicious. Bottle matured and brewed with a traditional Bavarian procedure.
